Our winter 2017 trip took us to Southeast Asia. Starting point and ending point are Taipei and Singapore, respectively. A few of the scenic wonders and historical highlights in between are shown here.

First destination was the famed natural wonders of Ha Long Bay, where protruding peaks from the sea present marvelous sights of earth, water, sun and wind in perfect harmony.
